**Givings Horse Race:**

Each week we will update how our general offerings are doing relative to budget. It'll look like a slow-motion horse race which will last all year! Here are our current numbers (as of June 11th):

Weekly Budget for general givings each week is \$7471.34

	Budget	Actual	Difference
Last Week	\$7,471.34	\$6936.10	-\$535.24
Year-to-date	\$171,840.82	\$185467.77	\$13626.95

We have slipped somewhat in our weekly givings last week. Also, as we head into the summer months and many people go away to the cottage, we have more likelihood of being under budget on givings. Some people decide each year to leave us enough of their giving envelopes to cover the period they will be away or they can write post-dated cheques. Alternatively, changing your giving method to Pre-Authorized Givings, takes care of the problem entirely. If you go away during the summer, could you opt for one of these strategies to help us out?

While many people take a vacation in the summer, our monthly costs do not. Here are some examples of our bills each month over the summer:
