Givings Horse Race: Each week we will update how our general offerings are doing relative to budget. It'll look like a slow-motion horse race which will last all year! Here are our current numbers as of Nov. 5.

Weekly Budget for general givings each week is \$7471.34

Last week's givings were just slightly above budget for the week. We are thankful to our generous parishioners for supporting our ministry and mission in this way.

At the end of October St. Luke's expenses exceeded revenues by \$26,000, almost exactly as projected in the 2017 budget. Continued strong general givings, a successful Christmas Market and interest income from our trust fund will close the gap. We also urge all parishioners to consider a generous special Christmas offering to ensure that we are able to finish the year in a break even position.
