Givings Horse Race

Each week we will update how our general offerings are doing relative to budget. It'll look like a slow-motion horse race which will last all year! Here are our current numbers as of Jan 7th. Each week, the budget for givings is \$7909.75. This is an estimate and will be firmed up when we pass the budget at the end of February. Corrections will be made retroactively to the first Sunday of January once we have the actual figure.
